Test of English as a Foreign Language

Who is the TOEFL exam for?

The Test Of English as Foreign Language (TOEFL) is the most widely accepted English-language test in the world. The TOEFL test measures your ability to communicate in English in colleges and universities. In addition, many government agencies, scholarship programmes, and licensing/certification agencies use TOEFL scores to evaluate English proficiency. In fact, more institutions accept TOEFL test scores than any other test scores in the world — more than 6,000 colleges, universities and licensing agencies in 136 countries to be exact.

What is involved in taking the TOEFL exam?

You can do the test on a **computer** (next generation internet-based test (iBT))

The TOEFL iBT test has four sections:

Reading: 60 - 100 minutes

3-5 passages, 12-14 questions each

Listening: 60 - 90 *minutes*

4-6 lectures, 6 questions each

2-3 conversations, 5 questions each

Speaking: 20 minutes

6 tasks, 2 independent and 2 integrated

Writing: 50 minutes

One integrated task and one independent task

An *integrated* task is one where you have to use more than one skill. For example, you **read** about something, **listen** to a lecture, and then **write** about what you have heard and read

How is the TOEFL exam graded?

The iBT (Internet Based Test) is graded out of 120 marks. Please refer to the Mapping your Level / Grade grid (www.kli.ie/map) for a breakdown of the results.
